Lea Holst, WILPF-Germany speaks about: Feminist Youth for Peace: WILPF Germany as an Example of Intergenerational Collaboration.

Lea Holst has been volunteering with WILPF Germany for five years, four of which she has served on the board. She is primarily responsible for finances, but she is also active in Young WILPF and the disarmament group.

In her professional work, she strives to incorporate aspects of social justice into global trade policy issues. In the past, she served as a project manager at FAIR SHARE of Women Leaders, an organization that advocates for more women in leadership roles within NGOs and has worked for human rights

organizations. Her work focuses on issues of global justice and political economy, with an emphasis on gender-based approaches.

WILPF Germany made the leap toward active intergenerational collaboration six years ago. Since then, the organization has built a board led by young people and an active Young WILPF group that continues to grow and engage new members, while experienced members and regional groups remain equally vital. This transition has proven successful, and the mutual learning it enables remains an enriching, ongoing journey. I will share the experiences and best practices of WILPF Germany, my personal experiences, as well as our concrete plans to deepen international connections within the global WILPF network. Together, let's explore how bridging generations can become one of peace movements' greatest strengths.
